History of the Society

Founded in 1538 this society comprised of scientists, explorers, researchers, and travelers from across the globe. The Society was largely inspired by the works of Leonardo Da Vinci, Sir Francis Drake, Ferdinand Magellan to name a few. In 1899 Harrison Highwater (Highwater Tower Tokyo Disney Sea) stole a idol from an African tribe called the Shiriki Utundu which curses Highwater during a New Years Party and well his elevator crashes and he is yet to be found. 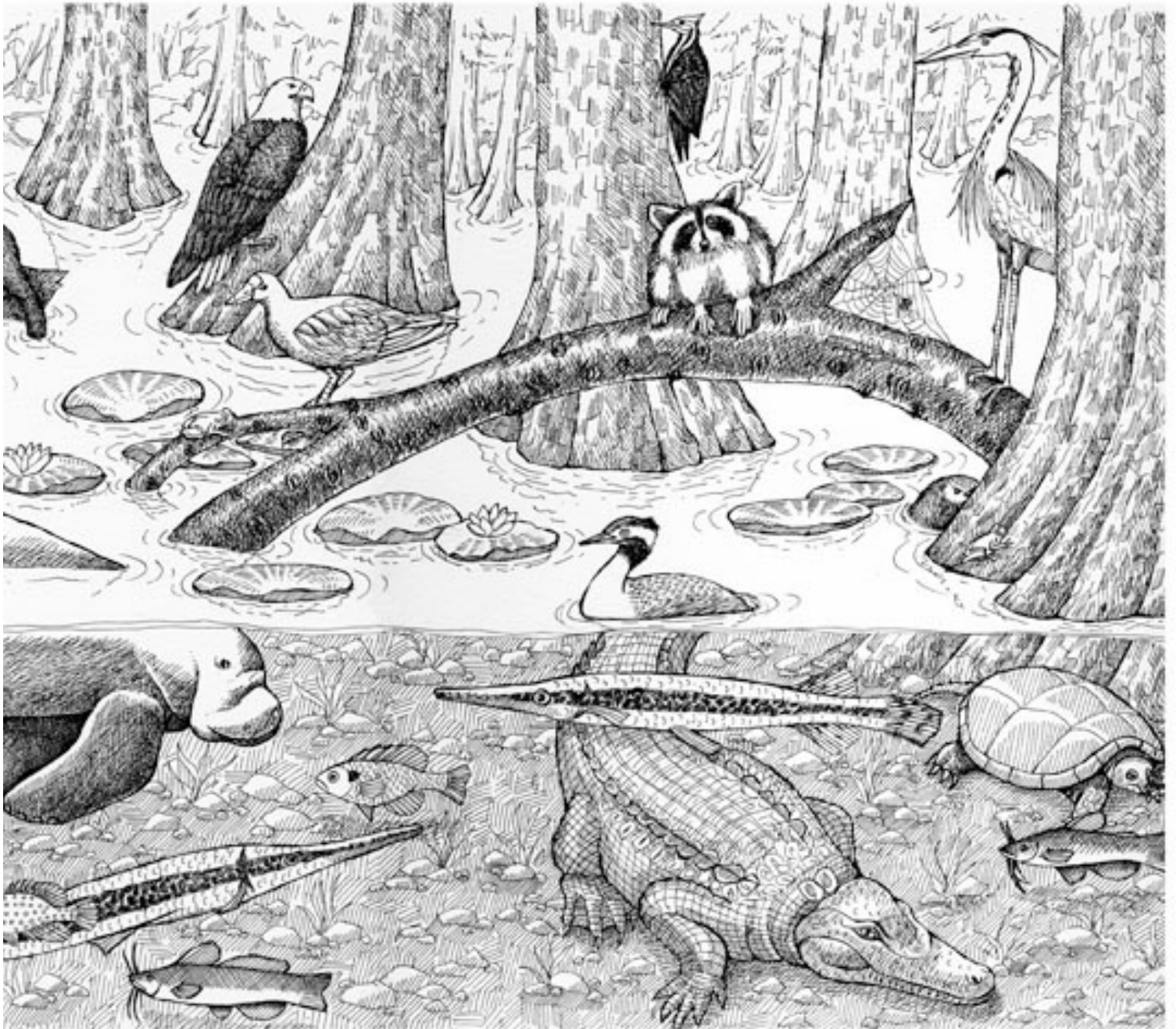

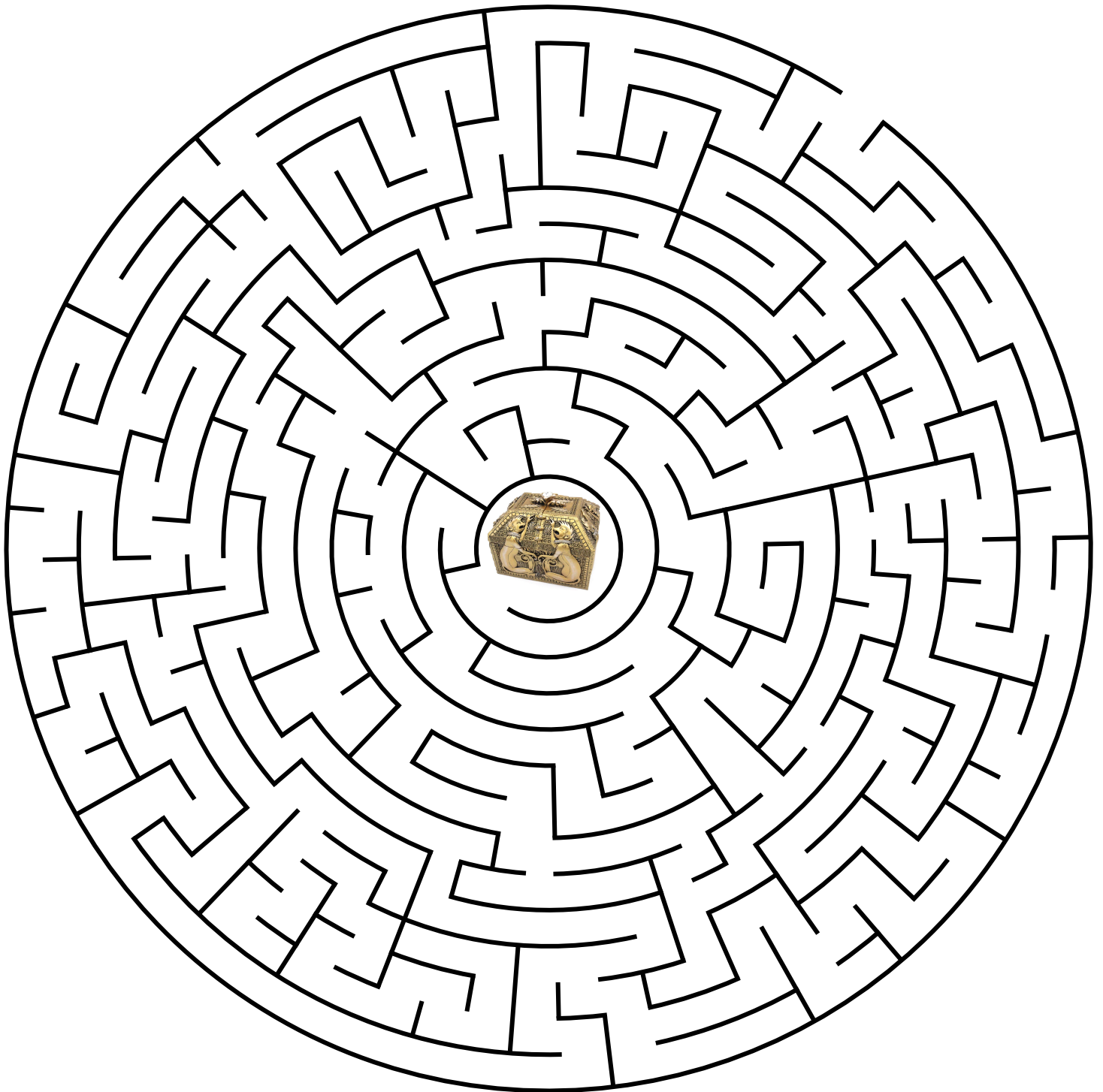

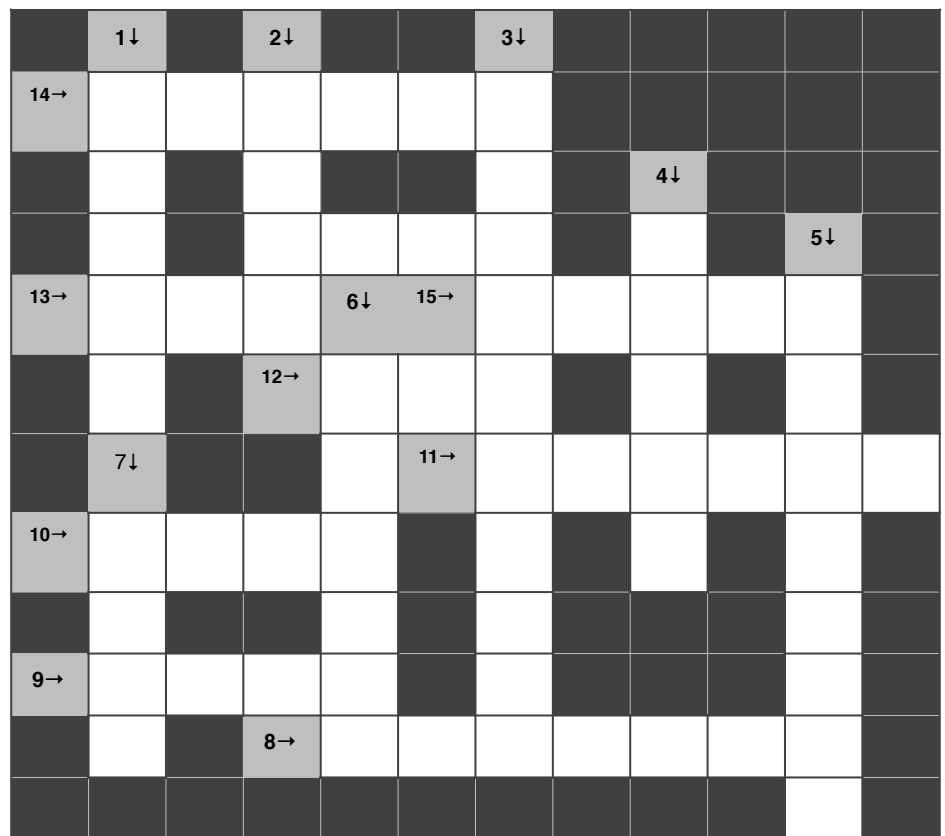

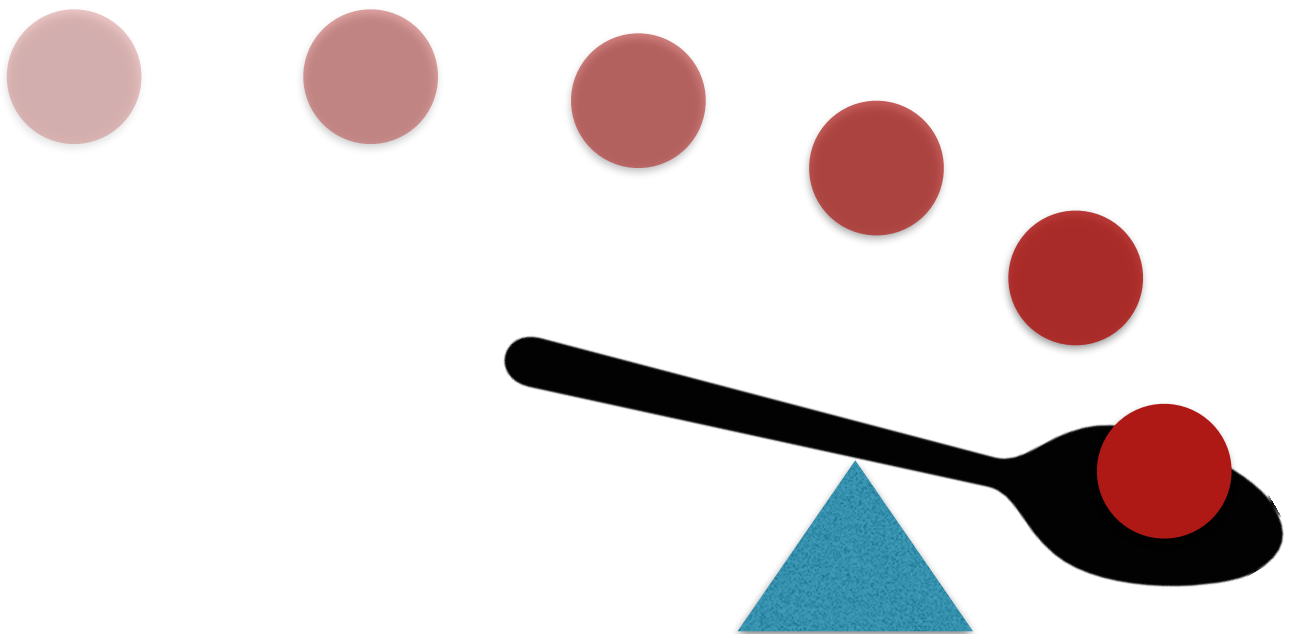

Innovation: Activity

Catapults were used in the medieval era as a weapon capable of launching stones or objects at their foes.

- Using supplies around you can you build your very own catapult? A spoon and an empty toilet roll?
- The middle triangle represents the fulcrum. When the force pushes down on the flat portion of the spoon an equal force launches the object into the air. A catapult is considered a type of lever.
- How far can you launch your object?

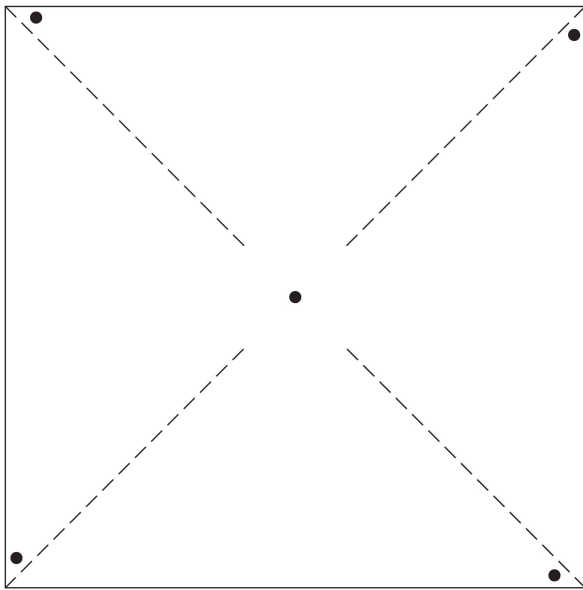

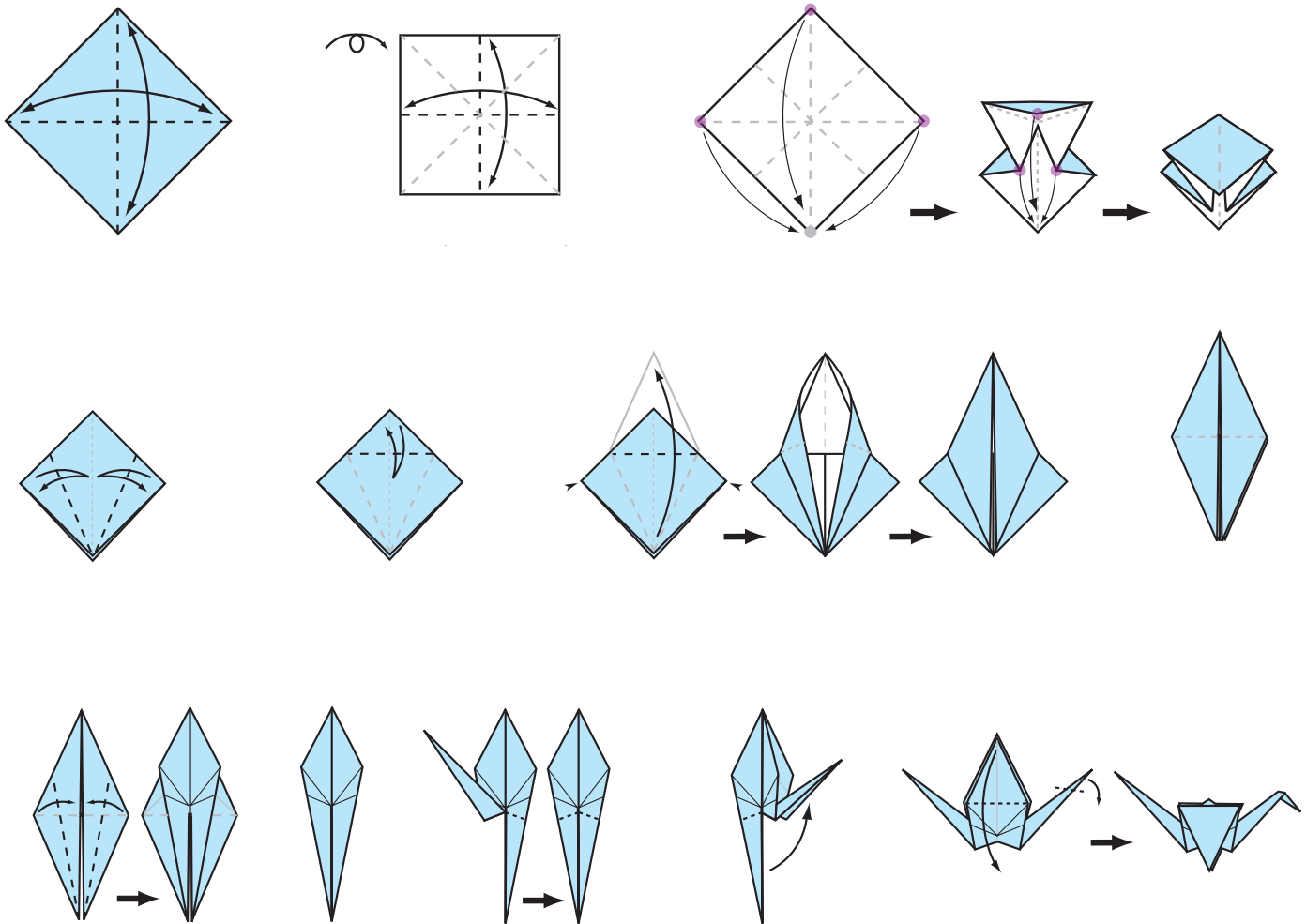
Innovation: Pin Wheel

- Finished!

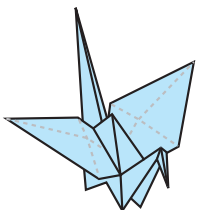


Innovation Origami
